Resident Spotlight....Dick and Mary Timpf



Mary and Dick Timpf are both natives of Michigan – Mary grew up in Detroit and Dick lived in Mt. Clemens. They met while attending Eastern Michigan University at a mutual friend’s wedding reception. After graduation, Mary taught high school in Harper Woods, Michigan and Dick began his career as a U.S. Army officer at Ft. Benning, GA. They were married in 1963 and moved to Ft. Lewis, Washington. They have moved 14 times – their favorite place being Hawaii! They have two wonderful daughters, Kimberley, who lives in Boston and is currently training for the Boston Marathon and Kristen, who lives in Potomac, MD and is busy trying to balance a full time job with taking care of a husband, two children, and three stepchildren.

While living in VA, Dick retired from the Army and since the girls were in college, they decided to stay in the area. He began his second career in business development. In 1999, Dick suffered a stroke. After almost a year in the hospital and rehab, he came home, but was confined to a wheelchair. Their two story house with the huge yard was no longer an option. They had land in Massachusetts – Dick went to graduate school in Boston and the company he worked for was

in Boston so they started vacationing there and bought property on Cape Cod. They build a home there in 2004 – it is completely accessible for Dick and close to the ocean for Mary. They sold their home in VA, but continued to visit and spend time with their five grandchildren. Last year, they decided to get an apartment at The Marque so they would have a place of their own when they came to visit – which is often!! They enjoy being Nana and Grandpa!

Dick used to love working in the yard and building things – which included remodeling the house several times! He loves to read and is very interested in history – he also enjoys teaching his grandsons Jackson, 8 and Griffin, 3, to play baseball. Dick is a loyal Red Sox fan and was so even before living in MA. Mary enjoys reading and spending time with her children and grandchildren – she loves the Cape because they live 5 minutes from Cape Cod Bay and 5 minutes from the Atlantic Ocean. Growing up in Detroit, she became a big baseball fan too. Her favorite pastime is to sit on the beach with a book and just watch the ocean and breathe in the salty air. They traveled a lot during their 23 years in the Army and they continue to enjoy traveling today. With Dick’s disability, they have to do a little more planning but they still drive up and down the coast – including an occasional trip to Florida.

Mary and Dick like being part time residents at The Marque – Dick says he enjoys it here because he can get Hazelnut coffee and have fun teasing Roberta! In addition to being close to family, they have enjoyed the friendships they have made here – both residents and staff members. There is always something to do whether it’s sitting by the fireplace in the lounge, playing games, or being at the pool. They feel like they have the best of both worlds – a nice home at the Cape where the weather is nice in the summer and they get to spend time with Kimberley and a nice home here when they want to get away from the snow and visit Kristen and her family.

Dick is a stroke survivor and both he and Mary give credit for his success to the love and strong support of their family- Mary said she could have never have done any of this without the help of their children. Dick’s advice to anyone in his situation is – never feel sorry for yourself and always keep your sense of humor!
