Ms. Willis was born in Jacksonville, FL, but moved 2 1/2 years later. As a child she moved quite frequently. She was in 3 different high schools her junior & senior years. She graduated from Kingsport, TN and got her bachelor's from King College in Bristol, TN. She then moved to Baltimore, MD where she worked in The Social Security Administration.

She remained well travelled her whole life, living in 10 different states! She says "It is easier to move than clean house!" She married and had 2 daughters and was a "stay at home mom" until her children went to elementary school. She started a small baking business that provided her with enough income to fund a Master's Degree in counseling from James Madison University! She became a substance abuse and mental health counselor for various public and private agencies, both inpatient and outpatient. In 1990 she opened a private practice in Manassas, VA working with various clients and many survivors of childhood trauma. She still holds her VA license and continues to do some counseling.

In 2001 she became a bi-coastal resident living in Olympia, WA and Warrenton, VA. It was about this time that she met Dick. They met in a singing group in Warrenton, VA. They both tried bi-coastal living and decided to make Olympia their home. After 3 years in WA they moved to Portland, OR for 5 years. In Portland she was as a receptionist in a law office where her counseling background came in handy.

After several years of being away from family, she and Dick decided it was time to return to the east coast. Her two daughters, live here; one in Ashburn with her husband and 3 year old daughter, and the other in Catharpin with her husband, 15 year old son and 6 year old daughter. Dick has a son and daughter in Warrenton, so living at The Marque allows them both to be near their families. Kathryn says she really enjoys living here at The Marque. She likes the "beautiful surroundings" and "all the activities" available. They have many friends here and are a wonderful asset!



## Richard Wormcke

Mr. Wormcke was born in Washington, DC in George Washington Hospital on George Washington's Birthday, but even with George surrounding him, his parents chose to name him Richard instead. He grew up in Brightwood, the NW section of D.C. He has wonderful childhood memories of his time in the District and many long time friends with whom he still keeps in touch.

Dick worked for the US Geological Survey of the Department of the Interior. He spent 39 years as a draftsman and map engineer. He served 2 years in the US Air Force. He and Bob Brooks (another one of our Marque residents), were both activated from the DC Air National Guard during the Korean conflict. Mr. Brooks was sent to Michigan and Dick to Delaware.

Dick has two children. His son lives in Warrenton with his wife and 18 year old son. His daughter and her husband live in Culpepper County with their two daughters, 9 and 12. His first wife died from Alzheimer's complications in 1999. Kathryn and he married in 2001.

A Civil War buff, Dick has participated in many Civil War reenactments during the 1960s in VA, MD, and WVA. He says he has been "killed 3 times" at First Manassas. He loves to find and search out Civil War relics and has been doing this for the last 20 years. He is also interested in photo art which is computer enhanced photography. He enjoys singing in the Warrenton Chorale which is where he met Kathryn.

Dick has enjoyed living in The Marque as its location is close to both he and Kathryn's family. He says he loves not having to repair things; he says "been there and done that". He enjoys the many activities like bingo, aerobics, book club, tea, cocktail club and the pool. He feels he has connected with both residents and the staff here. We feel the same!
